RE: Co-op Intern Day

Tuesday, June 11, 2019

Huxley Learning Center, Huxley, Iowa

We will be holding our annual Co-op Intern Day on Tuesday, June 11th. This one-day program is designed for all your Summer Interns to gain a better understanding of what a cooperative is and the opportunities they provide in the Midwest. We hope this event will help your interns appreciate the uniqueness of the cooperative they are spending the summer at and encourage them to consider a career working at a cooperative.

This a very discussion-oriented program with lots of opportunities for interaction with other interns in attendance.

We will begin the day at 10:00 and conclude no later than 4:00 to allow most of the attendees to travel to and from the event in the same day.

Dr. Keri Jacobs will lead the morning session focusing on the history and foundations of cooperatives and what makes them so unique. We will look to the 7 Cooperative Principles to guide this discussion. The purpose of this session is familiarizing your interns with what a cooperative is, why they matter and what makes them different from other business structures.

Mike Gaul, Director of Career Services at ISU College of Agriculture and Life Sciences will go through the steps of evaluating a job offer. When evaluating a job offer, the base salary is often the determining factor for new employees. Co-ops offer many benefits to their employees and Mike will walk the students through other components of a job offer that should have just as serious consideration, such as health and life insurance, retirement benefits such as 401K's and pensions and paid time off. Every student has different priorities and will need to know how to evaluate and determine the value of an offer on all its merits and career growth opportunities.

After lunch we will have a discussion panel comprised of three farmer cooperative leaders. The panel will share why cooperatives are important to them and what the value proposition is to their operations. We will explore with them the changes in the cooperative system, if these changes have been positive and what the effect of these changes has had on their relationship with their cooperative as it has changed and grown. The interns will have an opportunity to ask questions of the panel also.

Our final presenter, Dr. Will Secor, an economist with CoBank's Knowledge Exchange research division, will discuss blockchain and other emerging technologies that may impact your cooperative and services you provide in the future. Technology will continue to change how cooperatives interact with their suppliers, markets and producer members. What will this look like and how will younger employees and producers lead this change?

That's full day for your Summer Interns--a foundation about cooperatives, learning how to evaluate an employment offer, a panel on what makes cooperatives so valuable to their members and a look at blockchain and emerging technologies in the cooperative industry.

Please consider making this part of your summer intern program. Once you have determined who you would like to attend fill out the enclosed registration and return as soon as you can but no later than Friday, June 7th. The registration fee is \$120/intern for 1-4 interns or \$100 for 5 or more interns from the same cooperative. Cooperative staff is welcome to join us for some or all day for no additional charge. We ask that they register to assist in meal counts and seating arrangements.
