Dear IIC Members;

Our Annual Winter Workshops will be held on Wednesday, January 9th in Storm Lake and Thursday, January 10th in Cedar Falls. At these workshops, we host a variety of speakers and topics of importance that will help you in the decision-making process you go through at your local cooperative. The programs are intended for the Board of Directors and Senior Management staff who will be involved in formulating your cooperative's strategy. Listed below are the topics that we will be discussing this year. Please see the enclosed agenda for the specific order of the presentations.

The Impact of Technology – Most of us have heard about the development of driver less vehicles and when and how they might be available. Have you thought through the impact of this type of technology on your elevator locations? We have invited Dr. Dirk Maier of Iowa State University to explore this topic with you. Dr. Maier is an Engineering Professor who focuses on grain handling and storage. We have asked Dr. Maier to have some fun with you. He is going to explore what a country grain elevator may look like in 10 years with all the possibilities of technology integration. As you think about investment in your facilities and the affect that transportation and technology may have on how your system works, you should be aware of what your grain operations might look like soon.

Broadband Development - Any discussion today about rural economic development or attracting new talent to rural lowa quickly evolves into a discussion about broadband deployment across rural America. Regi Goodale serves as the Director of Regulatory Affairs of the Iowa Association of Electric Cooperatives. Regi is going to share what IAEC has identified as the opportunities and challenges of cooperatives delivering broadband to rural Iowa. A lot of experts like to refer to electric cooperatives delivering power to rural Iowa in the 1930's. This is a different challenge with its own unique hurdles to overcome. Some REC's have embraced the opportunity for broadband deployment and some have chosen to not participate at all. There is likely a place for cooperatives to participate in this technology and rural Iowans desperately need access to high speed broadband. Regi is going to share some thoughts on who and how this could get delivered to cooperative members, perhaps even working in partnership with multiple kinds of cooperatives.

After these two discussions, we will break for lunch and reconvene for two more presentations.

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Seasonal Employees - How many of you have identified hiring dependable, reliable employees as one of your challenges? Several cooperatives in lowa have explored hiring Hispanic workers as seasonal employees to meet the needs of your members. Nelly Limas is from Texas and has been working with several of our member cooperatives on providing legal, reliable seasonal workers in the spring and fall. Nelly is going to share what she can do for you, but just as importantly what you need to do to have a successful experience in hiring immigrant workers. This can be a partial solution to your employment challenges, but you need to be aware of the prerequisites to making this work. Nelly and her husband are going to share how you can utilize their services and what they expect of you.

Enterprise Risk Management - We all know and accept that agriculture is a risk laden venture. You manage the risk on your farm and business and try and identify and avoid those risk exposures before they happen. Have you spent time doing the same for your cooperative? It's hard enough to manage the risks that you assume everyday at your cooperative but have you and your leadership team spent any quality time trying to identify other risks and if there is any practical way to mitigate those risks. Bob Higgins is an Assistant Professor of Insurance and Risk Management at the University of Cincinnati. Prior to joining the University, Bob spent his career in Risk Management focusing on the agribusiness sector. Bob is going to take you through a discussion about what Enterprise Risk Management is and how you start the process at your cooperative.

We have planned a full day of pertinent and diverse topics, but all are relevant to issues your cooperative is facing today. We will have the same four presentations both days albeit in a different sequence to accommodate travel plans for our speakers.
